Privacy Policy

This privacy policy sets out how Christian Values in Education Scotland (CVE Scotland) uses and protects any information that you give when you use any of the websites owned by CVE Scotland, or when you attend any event run by CVE Scotland. CVE Scotland is committed to ensuring that your privacy is protected. Should we ask you to provide certain information by which you can be identified, you can be assured that it will only be used in accordance with this privacy statement.

The information you provide will be held in accordance with the Data Protection Act and may be used by CVE Scotland to supply the services which you have requested.

What we collect

We may collect the following information about you:

- Name;
- Contact information including email address, postal address and telephone number;
- Demographic information such as region and age;
- Disclosure Scotland PVG Declaration information, if a PVG should be required;
- Other information regarding event attendance, donations and use of our resources.

What we do with the information we gather

We require this information to serve you better, and in particular for the following reasons:

- Internal record keeping;
- Recording event attendance;
- Providing information and support;
- Processing donations and charges;
- Sending promotional emails regarding news, opportunities and appeals concerning CVE Scotland.

Where we store your personal data

Unfortunately, the transmission of information via the internet is not completely secure. Although we will do our best to protect your personal data, we cannot guarantee the security of your data transmitted to our various sites. Any transmission is at your own risk. Once we have received your information, we will use strict procedures and security measures to try to prevent unauthorised access.

Security

We are committed to ensuring that your information is secure. In order to prevent unauthorised access or disclosure, we have put in place suitable physical, electronic and managerial procedures to safeguard and secure as far as we are able the information we collect both online and offline.
